PAN Field Survey

In 2003, Americans for the Arts published a statistical report on the FY 2001 budgets and programming of public art programs across the Country. The Public Art Network (PAN) Council and AFTA have decided that it is time to update this information. A sub-committee of the PAN Council is currently developing new questions for the field, which will be asked of public art program directors and practicing artists in the next survey. It is expected that the 2007 survey will be electronically released to the field in September 2007.

This new survey will address trends in the field of public art and ask questions as to why the field is growing so quickly; the composition of public art programs and ordinances; the impact and role of technology in public art programs and for artists; financial and organizational structures; how programs and projects are funded; public art policies and procedures; collection management and conservation; and, how some of these issue areas are distinct by region, to name a few. What are you curious about?

Please share with us your questions about public art so that we may be able to incorporate them into the new instrument. The 2001 survey may be found on the Americans for the Arts website under Public Art Network Services and Materials.
